

# How to Use Study Guides for Training Videos

These instructions apply to the study guides for the following training videos.

1. Explaining Contextualization
2. How Do We Contextualize the Gospel for All Nations?
3. Understanding Honor and Shame
4. Honor and Shame in the Bible

The study guides are best used within a group discussion. Each is divided into 3 sections.

**Review Questions** -- This section is designed to draw attention to key ideas while participants are listening to the videos.

**Reflection Questions** -- These questions require more thought and are meant to facilitate group discussion for the sake of deeper understanding.

**Respond Questions** -- The final section guides participants to consider potential implications and applications of ideas found in the training video.

Since the videos are very brief introductions into each topic, participants are encouraged to continue the learning and reflection process by reading further on the selected topics.
